MANDATED REPORTER OFFICIAL RESOURCE AND RESPONSE GUIDE

PROHIBITED CONDUCT

- Sexual Harassment
- Sexual Assault
- Dating and Domestic Violence
- Stalking
- Discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression and/or related retaliation
- Sexual Exploitation
- Intimidation
- Hazing
- Bullying/Cyberbullying

If someone tells you they have experienced any form of prohibited conduct:

WHAT TO DO:

- If someone tells you they have experienced a form of prohibited conduct, first, offer them support, listen to them and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
- If the individual's safety is an immediate concern, call 911 or contact Campus Safety at 703-284-1600.
- Report the incident to the Title IX
 Coordinator in accordance with the Title
 IX Sexual and Interpersonal Misconduct
 Policy.
- Allow the Title IX Office to conduct the investigation in accordance with the Title IX Sexual and Interpersonal Misconduct Policy and related procedures.

If you have experienced any form of prohibited conduct:

WHAT TO KNOW:

- You are in control.
- You have the right to choose whom you will talk to, what resources you will use, what you will say, and when you will say it.
- If you choose to share your experience, your disclosure will be taken seriously and you will be treated with dignity and respect.
- The University will respond promptly and effectively to reports of Prohibited Conduct and will take appropriate action to prevent its occurrence, correct and address its effects, provide supportive measures, and, when warranted, issue discipline for violations of the Title IX Sexual and Interpersonal Misconduct Policy.
- You will be protected from retaliation.
 Marymount does not tolerate acts of retaliation against anyone filing a complaint or participating in an investigation.

ACTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- Preserve the physical evidence.
- Speak to a confidential resource.
- File a complaint with Title IX.
- Report to Law Enforcement.
- Go somewhere you feel safe.
- Seek supportive measures.
- Seek medical attention.
- Seek a sexual assault forensic exam.

OPTIONS:

- You have many resources available to you at Marymount and in the community.
- You have the right to report to the University to initiate a formal grievance process. Contact the Title IX Office at (703) 908-7561, titleix@marymount.edu.
- You have the right to report to local law enforcement to initiate a criminal process.

Retaliation for reporting is prohibited and should be reported to the Title IX Office. What can I do to support you?"
