2011-2012 Marymount University Fact Book Executive Summary

Perspectives: The Marymount University Fact Book provides current and historical University data on student enrollment, applicants, retention, and graduation. Data are consistent with official reporting requirements of federal, state, and private requestors. The following executive summary provides a snapshot of Marymount's current student body and recent trends in enrollment.

Marymount's Fall 2011 Student Body:

- There were 3,633 students enrolled for credit generating 3,196 credit FTEs.
- The student body consisted of 65% undergraduates and 35% graduates.
- Students represented 42 states and 63 foreign countries.

<u>Undergraduates</u>:

- 88% were full-time students and 12% were part-time.
- Approximately 7 out of 10 were female.
- 39% were members of racial/ethnic minority groups and 10% were international students.
- 65% were commuter students.
- 52% of undergraduates with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- Undergraduates represented 38 states (including D.C.) and 54 foreign countries.
- The largest programs were Business Administration (B.B.A.), Nursing (Accelerated B.S.N.), Biology, Psychology, and Fashion Merchandising.

Graduates:

- 45% were full-time students and 55% were part-time.
- More than 7 out of 10 (77.3%) were female.
- One quarter (26%) were members of racial/ethnic minority groups and 8% were international students.
- 46% of graduate students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- Graduate students represented 33 states (including D.C.) and 34 foreign countries.
- The largest programs were Forensic Psychology, Business Administration (M.B.A.), Physical Therapy, Clinical Mental Health Counseling, and Health Care Management.

Five-Year Trends in Enrollment:

- Marymount's overall headcount of 3,633 was the highest in five years.
- Total credit FTE climbed 7% to nearly 3,200 since Fall 2007.
- Full-time students increased from 66% to 73% from Fall 2007 to Fall 2011.

<u>Undergraduates</u>:

- Part-time enrollment decreased 7% over the last five years from 310 to 287, while full-time enrollment increased 8% during the period.
- Since Fall 2007, Hispanic students have increased 23%.
- International students increased 60% between Fall 2007 and Fall 2011.
- Business Administration realized the largest increase in program enrollments (30%) since Fall 2007.

Graduates:

- Between Fall 2007 and Fall 2011, the overall graduate headcount decreased 8% from 1,371 to 1,259.
- Full-time graduate enrollment increased 23% over the last five years.
- Black student enrollment decreased twice as fast (20%) as white students since Fall 2007.
- Business Administration and Education & Human Services program enrollments remained flat, while dropping more than 25% for Arts & Sciences and Health Professions.

Marymount's New Students:

<u>First-College</u>:

- 2,025 completed applications were submitted for Fall 2011.
 - o 78% of applicants were accepted by the University.
 - o 409 accepted applicants enrolled.
- The average high school GPA of the entering class was 3.09.
- The average SAT score was 503 for verbal, 489 for math, and 495 for writing.
- 70% of first-college students were resident students.
- Black and Hispanic first-college students increased 44% and 25%, respectively, over the last five years while white students decreased 24%.
- 58% of first-college students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- First-college students represented 27 states (including D.C.) and 12 foreign countries.

Transfer and Re-admitted Students:

- 840 completed applications were submitted for Fall 2011.
 - o 81% of applicants were accepted by the University.
 - o 371 accepted applicants enrolled.
- 85% of transfer and re-admitted students were commuters.
- International transfer students increased 38% since Fall 2007.
- 46% of transfer and re-admitted students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.

• Transfer and re-admitted students represented 18 states (including D.C.) and 14 foreign countries.

New Graduate Students:

- 1,112 completed applications were submitted in Fall 2011.
 - o 66% of applicants were accepted by the University.
 - o 391 accepted applicants enrolled.
- 45% of new graduate students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- New graduate students represented 29 states (including D.C.) and 20 foreign countries.

Retention & Graduation Rates:

- Marymount's Fall 2010 to Fall 2011 first-college retention rate was 70%.
- Marymount's official graduation rate (based on the Fall 2004 cohort) was 57%.
- 1,056 degrees and certificates were awarded in 2010-11.
- Business Administration and Health Professions had the highest freshman to sophomore retention rate at 75%.
- First-college students who enrolled without declaring a major had the highest freshman to sophomore retention rate increase from 56% (2008 to 2009) to 66% (2010 to 2011).

Faculty & Instruction:

- Of the 145 full-time and 201 adjunct faculty in Fall 2011, 87% and 47% of these faculty, respectively, held the highest degree in their field.
- 45% of the full-time faculty were tenured as of Fall 2011, with 39% more on tenure track.
- Since Fall 2007, an average of 71% of the full-time faculty were female.
- The five-year average class size for undergraduates was 18, and it was about 14 for graduates over the same period.
- Of the average credits generated by academic discipline from Fall 2007 to Fall 2011:
 - o 15,300 undergraduate and 426 graduate credits were in Arts & Sciences.
 - o 5,014 undergraduate and 2,551 graduate credits were in Business Administration.
 - 4,284 undergraduate and 4,037 graduate credits were in Education & Human Services.
 - o 5,063 undergraduate and 2,127 graduate credits were in Health Professions.

Tuition:


• In 2011-12, the tuition and fees rate for full-time undergraduates was \$23,972, an increase of 2.3% from the previous year.

- Room and board was \$10,580 in 2011-12, an increase of 2.5% from the previous year.
- 38% of Marymount expenses were dedicated to instruction, and 12% went towards academic support.

Financial Aid:

- 91% of full-time, degree-seeking first-college students received financial aid.
- 86% of full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates received financial aid.
- 74% of full-time, degree-seeking graduate students received financial aid.
- A five-year average of 76% of graduating undergraduates borrowed to pay for school, with the Class of 2011 having an average debt burden of \$23,667.
- In 2010-11, majority of student financial aid came from the following sources:
 - o 62% from the federal government, about 64% of which was in the form of loans (excluding parent loans).
 - o 27% from institutional sources, about 92% of which went to undergraduates.
- Based on preliminary figures for Fall 2011, 93% of first-college undergraduates received an average award of \$13,120 in the form of grants or scholarships.
