# Report on the Results of the **Graduating Student Survey, Spring 2023**



Undergraduate-level graduating students' responses to the question: "What were the strongest aspects of your MU education?"

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Each Spring semester, Marymount's Office of Planning and Institutional Effectiveness (PIE) administers a survey to the university's graduating students to evaluate their experiences at Marymount and to explore their plans for future careers and further education. Survey results are used to examine Marymount's effectiveness in providing students with a quality educational experience and to identify where to make improvements.

## **Survey Administration and Response Rates**

In Spring 2023, an invitation with a link to an online survey was sent to all graduating students, at both undergraduate and graduate levels. Graduate and undergraduate students were not required to complete the survey as a condition for receiving graduation tickets. Non-responders received periodic reminder emails. Of the 903 graduating students who were contacted, 736 students responded, for an overall response rate of 69%. Sixty-seven (67%) percent of the undergraduate graduating class responded as well as Seventy (70%) percent of the graduate-level graduating students.




Chart 1: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.


Chart 2: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.

Chart 4: Percentage of student respondents who rated preparation as "good" or "excellent"






Chart 5: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.











Chart 8: Number of student respondents who responded that the experience allowed them to:

Chart 9: Percentage of student respondents who responded that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied" with MU facilities





Chart 10: Percentage of student respondents who responded that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied"





Chart 10: Percentage of student respondents who responded that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied"





## **OVERALL EVALUATIONS**

# What are the strongest aspects of your MU education?

## Theme 1: Quality of Faculty/Staff/Academic Program (N = 118)

The overwhelming majority of strengths cited by students related to the quality of the faculty at Marymount. Students mentioned how supportive and helpful professors which helped them easily navigate through difficult course material. Students also noted how most of their academic programs were challenging enough, helping them prepare for their future careers. Students also mentioned how professors always wanted them to succeed and were a great support system throughout their educational journey.

## Theme 2: Individual Learning Outcomes/Programs (N = 52)

Students noted the quality of individual academic programs and the development of individual skill sets, such as researching and critical thinking. Students also mentioned that their classes helped them develop their leadership, communication, and writing skills. Students also mentioned honing their time management skills and learning how to effectively engage in team work.

## Theme 3: Experiential Learning and Career Preparation (N = 28)

Students praised the opportunities for experiential learning at Marymount, such as leadership and research experiences. Students particularly mentioned internships, clinical placements, and opportunities to network helped them in developing their soft skills.

## Theme 4: Campus Location, Culture, and Environment (N = 23)

Students also applauded the university's intimate and diverse community and the friendships they were able to form during their time at Marymount.

## Theme 5: Class Sizes and Courses (N = 19)

Students appreciated the smaller class sizes which positively facilitated their learning. Students also appreciated a wide variety of courses available for their degree programs exposing them to different areas in the field.

## Theme 6: Other (N = 18)

Students cited ability to be employed while going to school and their overall positive experiences.

# What aspects of your Marymount education need the most improvement?

## Theme 1: Faculty & Administrative Services (N = 63)

Many students commented on the need to improve the quality of professors overall, need for better communication between the students and faculty, and the need to ensure that faculty members remain active and up to date in their profession. Students mentioned the need for advisors to be well-versed in academic degree plans.

## Theme 2: Services and Facilities (N = 55)

Students mentioned a need for more clean places to study. They also mentioned updating class rooms and study areas along with upgrading the dining hall. Students also mentioned improving parking facilities and student services like financial aid and student accounts.

## Theme 3: Experiential Learning and Career Preparation (N = 30)

Students stated that they need additional assistance to be placed and there needs to be new and improved requirements that reflect the profession and competence level. Students were disappointed with the faculty' and staffs' guidance in obtaining field, research, networking and internship experiences.

## Theme 4: Course Availability & Flexibility (N = 28)

Students noted a need for classes in their major to have more time options. Students also noted the need to have better general education class options as well as having online class options for their electives. Students mentioned the need for more course flexibility.

## Theme 5: Student Life & Services (N = 25)

Students noted the lack of communication regarding student clubs and organizations. Students also noted a need for the school to be commuter friendly.

#### Theme 6: Communication (N = 20)

Students suggested a need to improve communication specifically within the departments of residential life, financial aid, student accounts, and the administration.

Students also expressed annoyance over not feeling heard by the university about their concerns. Students mentioned the need for flexible course scheduling and more class options. Students mentioned a need for more networking opportunities and incorporating field trips in certain majors for practical learning experiences.

## Theme 3: Services/Facilities (N = 14)

Students cited the need to improve financial aid, parking facilities, and student account services.

## Theme 4: Student life (N = 7)

Students cited a need to have more diverse student organizations and activities on campus for socialization.






Chart 15: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.


Chart 16: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.

Chart 17: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.




Chart 18: Percentage of student respondents who rated preparation as "good" or "excellent"


Chart 19: Percentage of students responding that they agree or strongly agree with statements.

Chart 20: Percentage of student respondents who rated MU's contribution to their development of skills as "somewhat" or "to a great extent"









Chart 24: Percentage of student respondents who responded that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied"





Chart 25: Percentage of student respondents who responded that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied"







## **OVERALL EVALUATIONS**

## What are the strongest aspects of your MU education?

## Theme 1: Schools/Programs/Faculty (N = 114)

Students noted the quality of Marymount's faculty, specialized accreditation of programs, and the quality of program curricula to be excellent. Students mentioned getting a chance to develop close relationships with their professors and faculty members. Students mentioned that professors were knowledgeable and committed and wanted them to succeed. Students also mentioned that having a smaller student to teacher ratio also helped them with learning and found course material to be interesting and challenging at the same time.

## Theme 2: Experiential Learning and Career Preparation (N = 62)

Students praised the opportunities for experiential learning at Marymount, such as networking, internships, and clinical placements which gave them an opportunity to think critically and apply the concepts learned outside the classroom. Practical experiences and networking gave them an opportunity to learn more about different options regarding their chosen career path.

## Theme 3: Individual Learning Outcomes (N = 46)

Students noted the quality of the university's academic programs in the development of individual skill sets, such as researching and critical thinking. Students also mentioned that their classes helped them develop their leadership, communication, and writing skills.

#### Theme 4: Class Flexibility and Courses (N = 36)

Students appreciated the wide variety of electives available for them to choose from. Students also appreciated the flexibility of online class options.

## Theme 5: Student diversity, Culture, and Community (N = 12)

Students praised the university's sense of community and getting the opportunity to meet people from diverse backgrounds and getting to know more about other cultures.

## What aspects of your Marymount education need the most improvement?

#### Theme 1: Services and Facilities (N = 60)

Students mentioned a need for improving financial aid services. They also mentioned a need for updated equipment in labs. Students also mentioned improving parking facilities. Students mentioned a need for improving administrative services at the University.

#### Theme 2: Schools/Programs/Faculty (N = 59)

Students made many program-specific suggestions for improvement, but were generally related to additional coursework in areas that would improve rigor and the curriculum in general. Many commented on the need to improve the quality of advisors and to ensure that faculty remain active and up to date in their profession.

## Theme 3: Experiential Learning and Career Preparation (N = 41)

Students stated that they need additional assistance to be placed for their clinical placement specifically. Students were disappointed with the faculty's guidance in obtaining field, research, and networking and internship experiences. For certain programs, students preferred in person networking over Zoom.

#### Theme 4: Course Availability Selection (N = 37)

Students noted a need for classes to have more time options. Students also noted a need for course flexibility to cater to those who work full-time.

## Theme 5: Communication (N = 22)

Students suggested a need to improve communication specifically within the department of financial services as well as communication between the University and their program school. Students also mentioned having communication regarding events for graduate students.

# Theme 1: Faculty/School/Programs (N = 33)

Students praised the quality of teachers and the education they got, but also expressed concerns about not getting enough guidance and help in getting internships.

# Theme 2: Services/Facilities and Communication (N = 30)

Students cited a need to improve financial aid services as well as more communication between professors and University's administrative departments.

# Theme 3: Course Flexibility (N = 12)

Students mentioned an opportunity to have more flexibility in choosing their classes as well as flexibility in timings and mode of instruction.

#### Theme 4: Career Exploration and Networking (N = 7)

Students cited a need for better networking events for graduate students and better career advisors who can assist them in their job search.
